eptember 22nd is Fall Prevention Day. Falls can be serious health risks for older adults and can lead to other complications. In the spirit of the day, take a look around your (or your loved one's house) and ask yourself if you see any fall hazards. Common hazards include electrical cords, furniture that has been moved, rugs, and even dogs that get underfoot. Most people will begin to rearrange their furniture as they head into the holidays to accommodate seasonal decorations, but this type of reorganization can confuse those with dementia.

This month's educational theme at the center is "C.A.L.M. About: Collecting, Hoarding, & Caregiving." We will discuss the difference between collecting and hoarding. How do you help someone who is a hoarder? What are some tips for caregivers to help their loved ones reduce clutter and only keep those items which are



CA Task Force on Family Caregiving

he California Task force on Family Caregiving released its Final Report ("Picking Up the Pace of Change in California") on policy recommendations for state legislators on the topic of caregiving. The recommendations are intended to address some of the challenges California family caregivers face and help caregivers continue in their roles without harm to themselves. The CA Task Force on Family Caregiving concluded that existing policies in CA to support caregivers have not kept pace with changing needs.

- <u>Recommendation 1:</u> Support the financial wellbeing of family caregivers and limit the extent to which caregiving increases poverty risk and long-term financial insecurity.
- <u>Recommendation 2:</u> Modernize and standardize caregiver assessments across the state to increase service utilization tracking.

- <u>Recommendation 3:</u> Equip caregivers with education and training for their specific situation.
- <u>Recommendation 4:</u> Increase access to affordable caregiver services and respite.
- <u>Recommendation 5:</u> Integrate family caregivers into hospital processes, support them in navigating care transitions, and offer more support and education regarding complex care tasks.
- <u>Recommendation 6:</u> Increase funding to the CA Caregiver Resource Center system to expand services.
- <u>Recommendation 7:</u> Support a statewide advisory council on matters affecting family caregivers that provides advice on integrating caregiver issues across state departments, services, initiatives, and programs, and provides policy expertise to the legislature.
