

Resource Spotlight USC Leonard Davis Family Caregiver Support Center



re you taking care of someone with dementia or Alzheimer's? Does your loved one have a tendency to wander? According to the Alzheimer's Association, 60% of people with dementia will wander at some point. L.A. Found is a groundbreaking countywide initiative to help locate people with Alzheimer's, dementia, or autism who wander. L.A. County Supervisor Janice Hahn, who championed establishing this program, said "L.A. Found will not only save lives— it will provide peace of mind to

caretakers countywide. They will know they are not alone. The County is just as committed to keeping their loved ones safe as they are."

As part of the L.A. Found initiative, Project Lifesaver provides a voluntary system of trackable bracelets for at-risk individuals. The Project Lifesaver tracking system is currently being used by cities across the county.

When a person wearing a Project Lifesaver bracelet

goes missing, caregivers are asked to quickly call 911 and advise the operator that the missing person is wearing a Project Lifesaver bracelet. The Project Lifesaver bracelet is not under constant monitoring.

Once the person is reported missing, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department deploys a specially equipped team to assist with search and rescue. The Sheriff's Department can also use helicopter-mounted receivers to assist the ground search team to help locate the missing person.

Do you qualify for Project Lifesaver? The L.A. County Sheriff's Department and/or Workforce Development, Aging, and Community Services

(WDACS) will need to speak with the family caregiver to complete a brief phone interview. If the person you care for qualifies, you will be sent instructions on how to purchase the bracelet directly from Project Lifesaver. WDACS will assist you in registering the device with the Sherriff's Department, setting up the bracelet and training the caregiver on how to replace the battery.

A bracelet costs \$325.00 plus tax and shipping. Leasing options are also available through Project Lifesaver. If you cannot afford a bracelet, you may qualify for a free bracelet. For more information, please call 1-833-569-7651 or contact your assigned Family Care Navigator for a referral.
